## **UNIZIK GOVERNING COUNCIL APPOINTS PROF. CHARLES OKECHUKWU ESIMONE AS 6TH SUBSTANTIVE VICE-CHANCELLOR**



The Governing Council of Nnamdi Azikiwe University, Akwa has appointed a new Vice-Chancellor for the University. He is Prof. Charles Okechukwu Esimone, (Fellow Academy of Science).

In a remark shortly before the announcement and formal presentation of letter of appointment, the Pro-Chancellor and the Chairman of Council Alhaji Azeez Oladotun Bello thanked the members of Council for their efficiency and sacrifice in the discharge of their duty. He also congratulated the new Vice-Chancellor for emerging tops in the rigorous selection process and urged him to work in the overall interest of the University.

**Charles Okechukwu Esimone** was born on December 31, 1970 in Tiko, Cameroon. He graduated from St. Joseph's College Sasse, Cameroon and with B. Pharm, M. Pharm and PhD from the University of Nigeria. He is Professor of Biopharmaceutics and Pharmaceutical Microbiology in the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Nnamdi Azikiwe University and the Pioneer Dean of the Faculty. Professor Esimone was the former Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academic) of the Nnamdi Azikiwe University, Awka. He became a professor at the age of 37, emerging as the youngest professor in the University and her first professor of Pharmacy as well as the first professor of Pharmaceutical Microbiology in Southeastern Nigeria. He has well over 200 publications. Recently, in "The List of 28 Most

Published Scholars in Nigeria", Prof. Charles Okechukwu Esimone was nominated as the 18th most published scholar in Nigeria. He has pioneered research in the use of recombinant viral vectors as surrogates for high through-put antiviral screening studies and on the use of indigenous medicinal plants as immunomodulators, vaccine adjuvants and anti-infectives. His vector-based antiviral screening technique developed between 2003 and 2005 in Germany has significantly revolutionized high-throughput screening for anti-HIV compounds world-wide. He speaks English, French and German. He is a recipient of several awards which include the Alexander von Humboldt Fellowship to Germany (2003-2005), Visiting Scientist to the University of Pittsburgh, USA (2007-2008), the ANDI Bright Contest Award for the Best African Innovative Researcher, South Africa (2009), Young Scientist representing Nigeria at the "Summer davos" Annual Meeting of New Champions, Tianjin, China (2010) and the CV Raman Senior Fellowship, India (2013). He is a member of the Governing Council of the Pharmacists Council of Nigeria, the Nnamdi Azikiwe University and the Nanomedicine Society of Nigeria. He is indeed the Pioneer National President of the Nanomedicine Society of Nigeria. He has successfully supervised over 50 postgraduate students. He is a recipient of various national and international grants and a reviewer to several national and international journals. He is a member of several professional bodies including the Global Young Academy and the American Society for Cell Biology. Prof. Esimone is a Fellow of the Nigerian Academy of Science, Fellow of the Pharmaceutical Society of Nigeria and Fellow of the Nigerian Academy of Pharmacy. He is the State Campus Coordinator for Deeper Life Campus Fellowship, Anambra State and also a member, BOT (Board of Trustees) of Anchor University, Lagos. He is happily married and the marriage is blessed with three boys and two girls.

He hails from Akwaeze in Anaocha Local Government Area of Anambra state.

## SEN (DR.) NNAMANI DELIVERS UNIZIK'S 13TH CONVOCATION LECTURE



A former Senate President of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, distinguished Senator (DR) Ken Nnamani recently delivered the convocation lecture as part of events marking the institution's 13<sup>th</sup> Convocation ceremonies.

Speaking on *“National Integration, Peace and Development,”* Sen. Nnamani celebrated Nnamdi Azikiwe, the great 'Zik

of Africa' who according to him, embodied the spirit of national unity and integration. Reviewing education as one of the national integrators, Sen. Nnamani said it can shape the pattern of economic and socio-political development. On the country's stunted national development and leadership deficit, he blamed it on the collapse of quality higher education.

The former Senate President pinned Nigeria's democracy issues on the absence of normative for sustainable democratic governance. The lecture argued that this thrives in Western, liberal societies where it has helped to create civility, quality education and in turn, has engendered critical capabilities required for economic competitiveness.

Condemning the politics of ethnicity, Sen. Nnamani urged graduands to

embrace patriotic beliefs and sentiments that will help them see themselves as Nigerians than members of ethnic and religious communities. He decried stereotypes and indifference as the core causes of disunity. In his words, rather than past African leaders reversing the colonial dictatorship bequeathed to us, they decentralized it. “The new Nigerian leader manipulated ethnic sentiments for personal and political goals. This enthroned the politics of fear of marginalization and mutual distrust.” He outlined two stops to a country's roadmap to success: failure to anticipate a problem before its arrival hence no sensitization to its possibility and imperceptivity that the problem has arrived.

## PROF. AHANEKU DELIVERS ON MAKING CONVOCATION AN ANNUAL EVENT

The Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Joseph E. Ahaneku, FAS has delivered on the promise made by his administration from the onset to make convocation a part of annual academic culture.

Following its fourth consecutive stride within a five-year administration, convocation has become an integral part of his tenure. In his words, Prof. Ahaneku stated that there is good case for the elation, aside from the conviviality associated with convocation, it could serve as inspiration for University students and prospective students.

The 13<sup>th</sup> convocation for the

2018/2019 academic year significantly marked the fulfillment of that vision and mission. The highpoint of the last outing was the conferment of 6500 First degrees; 182 Postgraduate diplomas, 763 Masters degrees; and 269 Ph.D degrees. Honorary degrees were conferred on three distinguished Nigerians; HRM Igwe Nnaemeka Achebe, Agbogidi, CFR, mni, Obi of Onitsha; Sir Emeka Ofor and Ambassador Babagana Kingibe, CFR, GCON.

Recall that the recently concluded convocation served as the University's 13<sup>th</sup> and the consecutive fourth back-to-back by the

Ahaneku-led administration in its five years' tenure. March 2016 saw the maiden convocation outing of his administration after his assumption of duty in June 2015. This will be the last convocation for the Ahaneku-led administration since he will be vacating office by the first week of June.

The Chairman of the 13<sup>th</sup> Convocation Lecture and former INEC Chairman, Prof. Attahiru Muhammadu Jega has warned academics to be the solution to the problems in the society rather than ruing.

Prof. Jega made this call at the University Auditorium following

creation of ethnic political parties. "We cannot forever blame the colonizers for the ill that has bedeviled us, we need a change in context and content of our politics," he said.

Prof. Jega blamed Nigeria for lacking basic commitment to build credible universities which in turn has barred the country from producing good leaders. So far, the country has been able to produce leaders who went to school but did not go through school.

To the University Community, Prof. Jega charged the academics to be impatient over the results they see and to avoid the business of teaching researched knowledge, but participate in choosing the right leaders or become one themselves. "Don't agonize over our national problems but look for a way to contribute in making positive changes."

## CHIEF DAN UWANDU TAKES A BOW WITH FACULTY OF ARTS' FIRST VALEDICTORY LECTURE



The teachers' teacher, Chief Dan Nwedo Uwandu, has recently taken a bow as he delivered Faculty of Arts' first valedictory speech at Arts Theatre.

Instrumental in founding the department of Theatre Arts and Film Studies, Chief Uwandu in his goodbye lecture described his 38 years of teaching as a

journey where his life like a candle, burned out so that others could see. According to him "As at 1993 when the department was created, there were just six students, but today there are 400 students with about 879 who already had graduated from the department". To Chief Uwandu, teaching is when a teacher looks beyond the outer facade but reaches to the students' inner selves. He was grateful for the serendipitous occasion, as he described it as a chance to express gratitude, a final gift to all who





became family along the line.

The Vice-Chancellor, Professor Joseph Ahaneku, FAS in his words described Chief Uwandu as the conscience of hard work, one who has done well in this (teaching) enterprise. “Dan is a teacher who single-handedly created this department. So the University is happy with him because he didn't only teach but he served well.”

The chairman of the event, Prof. Jude Emeka Madu during his opening remark, described Chief Uwandu as a beacon, a teacher of teachers. Prof. Madu said the occasion was a way to pay honour to whom it is due.

The Head of Department of Theatre Arts and Film

Studies, Prof. Alex Asigbo, represented by the former Dean, Prof. Tracie Utoh-Ezeajugh hailed Chief Uwandu as a pace-setter, one who made way where there was no way and insisted on vibrant and excellent education culture. Prof Asigbo described the department as Uwandu's department while he commended his style of work and his strong refusal to vices.

The Dean, Faculty of Arts, Very Rev. Fr. Prof. Bonachristus Umeogu, in his address spoke on the essence of service time—that last syllable of recorded time. Quoting Shakespeare, Prof. Umeogu stressed that someday one must say good bye, but what matters is how one got to the end.

The highpoint of the farewell event was the unveiling of a book compiled in honour of Chief Uwandu, *The Teacher of Teachers: A Festschrift for Dan Uwandu*.

## FREE GLAUCOMA SCREENING EXERCISE

There will be a free Glaucoma Screening exercise at the University Medical Centre. The exercise is being organized by a corps member, Dr. Ngozi Lovelyn Onuba (an Optometrist) serving in the centre.

The screening exercise will include: vision assessment, eye health assessment and free examination of intraocular pressure (eye pressure: the major controllable cause of glaucoma). Date: 14<sup>th</sup> - 16<sup>th</sup> May and 20<sup>th</sup> - 23<sup>rd</sup> May, 2019.

### HEALTH TIPS: GLAUCOMA: PREVENTION & RISK FACTORS

High eye pressure does not cause glaucoma, but it is a risk factor. Learn about other risk factors for glaucoma and ways to lower your risk to possibly prevent the disease.

#### Risk Factors for Open-Angle Glaucoma

##### Strong risk factors for open-angle glaucoma include:

- High eye pressure
- Family history of glaucoma
- Age 40 and older for African Americans
- Age 60 and older for the general population, especially Mexican Americans
- Thin cornea
- Suspicious optic nerve appearance with increased cupping (size of cup, the space at the center of optic nerve, is larger than normal)

##### Potential risk factors for open-angle glaucoma include:

- High myopia (very severe nearsightedness)
- Diabetes
- Eye surgery or injury
- High blood pressure
- Use of corticosteroids (for example, eye drops, pills, inhalers, and creams)

#### Prevention: Lower Your Risk of Glaucoma

If you're at risk of developing glaucoma, medical experts recommend a healthy lifestyle that includes regular exercise and a nutritious diet to improve your overall physical and mental well-being. Taking care of your mental and emotional health is also important.

##### Suggestions for general physical well-being include:

- Maintain a healthy weight.
- Keep your blood pressure at a normal level and control other medical conditions.
- Don't smoke.
- Limit caffeine intake to moderate levels, because some evidence suggests that high amounts of caffeine may increase eye pressure.
- Try to exercise daily by doing physical activities such as walking, swimming, or working in the yard.
- Prevent overexposure to sunlight by wearing sunglasses and hats when you're outdoors.
- Get regular, comprehensive eye exams, and consult your doctor if you notice changes in your vision.
- If you are African American, taking prescription eye drops could cut your risk of getting glaucoma in half.

#### “Vision” Foods to Support Eye Health

Are you eating the foods that are best for protecting your eyes?

Learn which foods boost your vision health.

**Dark green, yellow, and orange fruits and vegetables:** These foods contain carotenoids, which may defend against several medical conditions, including glaucoma. Lutein and zeaxanthin are especially important for vision health. They are found in dark, leafy greens such as spinach, collard greens and kale, as well as in yellow corn, okra, broccoli, Brussels sprouts, mango, green beans, sweet potatoes, lima beans, squash, green, yellow and orange bell pepper and egg yolks.

**Fruits and vegetables abundant in vitamin C:** These foods include green peppers, citrus fruits, tomatoes, broccoli, strawberries, sweet and white potatoes, leafy greens and cantaloupe.

**Foods containing vitamin E:** These foods include eggs, fortified cereals, fruit, wheat germ, green leafy vegetables, nuts, nut oils, vegetable oils and whole grains.

**Foods containing vitamin A:** Eat liver, sweet potatoes, carrots, mangoes, milk, and egg yolks.

**Foods with vitamin D:** The main dietary sources are cod liver oil, “oily” fish, fortified milk and cereal, and egg yolks.

**Foods with zinc:** These foods include oysters, red meat, poultry, beans, nuts, certain seafood, whole grains, fortified breakfast cereals, and dairy products.

**Foods with omega-3 fatty acids:** Wild salmon, sardines, walnuts, flax seeds, and chia seeds are good sources.

#### Are There Foods to Avoid?

There are no specific foods to avoid regarding glaucoma, however, caffeine, one of the main substances in coffee can cause a several point rise in eye pressure that lasts for at least 90 minutes. Whether that increase is of concern is best addressed between the patient and their eye doctor. A good rule of thumb is to exercise moderation with caffeine consumption. One cup of coffee is unlikely to cause any harm, but if you like to drink large amounts of coffee consider switching some of that consumption to decaffeinated.
