## PROF. ONYENEKWE DELIVERS 47TH INAUGURAL LECTURE



Prof. Chinedum Charles Onyenekwe of the Department of Medical Laboratory Science has delivered the 47<sup>th</sup> Inaugural lecture of Nnamdi Azikiwe University.

Speaking on “My Health, my Body and these Diseases,” Prof. Onyenekwe described health as a complete, physical, mental and social well-being, and not merely an absence of disease. “The body functions through coordinated systemic and local communications between and amongst

cells. This makes the human body function as a unit,” he said.

He stressed on Parasitaemia and its threshold in pregnant women; stressors that can affect life such as poor lifestyle, poor diet; the lecture shockingly showed the difference between feeding and eating, how academic stress and poor office space can lead to bad health, how neonatal malnutrition can diminish a child's intelligence quotient, weight and general behaviour, among other things.

The Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Joseph Ahaneku, FAS, represented by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Administration), Prof. Carol Arinze-Umobi in his

remark, described the topic as recondite but germane, one that begs careful examination of how one's life is led. The VC took out time to remind professors who have not given their own lectures to do so, describing it as a must, a debt one owes and must be paid before retirement.

The Chairman, Inaugural Lecture Committee, Prof. Richard Uwakwe expressed his gratefulness to the lecturer of the day for a perfect execution of the topic. Prof. Uwakwe praised the committee for their remarkable stride in the last four years which equals the University's record of same amount of inaugural lectures over the past 21 years.

## DEAN OF STUDENTS' AFFAIRS TAKES COMMUNITY SERVICE TO ANOTHER LEVEL



Words cannot explain the joy that enveloped Isiokwe community of Akama-Oghe in Ezeagu L.G.A of Enugu state over the weekend following the commissioning of an electricity project in the locality. The community had lived for donkey's years without experiencing electricity despite appeals to the government.

It took proactive measures of Professor Stan Udedi, Dean of Students' Affairs and member of the community to provide the much needed succour.

Commissioning the project, the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Joseph Ahaneku, FAS described the gesture as worthy of emulation. He described Prof. Udedi as a goal-getter who had completed the 3 basic ideals the University system stands for which include, "Lecturing, Research and

Community service". Prof. Ahaneku expressed hopes that the electricity project would birth more goodwill for the community while calling on well-meaning individuals to embrace community service in their various communities. Prof. Ahaneku urged the community members to guard the project with all sense of ownership to avert vandalism.

In his remark, the Resident Electoral Commissioner of Imo state, Professor Emeka Ezeonu noted that the capital project is worthy of commendation. Describing the sponsor, Professor Udedi as a mobilizer, Prof. Ezeonu commended all who partnered with Prof. Udedi in putting smiles on the faces of the community members.

Counting it all joy, Prof. Udedi explained that the issue of darkness had brought untold hardship to the community for over 37 years. In his words, "Ugwu Isiokwe community situates on hills and in valleys and this negatively affect the living conditions of the people. The lack of power until now made matters worse. The event of today renews hope for

greater output and productivity by the people.

"We are committed to continued community development and we will effectively put our resources for greater exploit in the future". He expressed deep gratitude to the prompt financial and technical support of his partners. "I am highly indebted to his Excellency, Sen. Ike Ekweremmadu, the Deputy Senate President, Hon. Fred Chukwudi Ezinwa, Executive Chairman Ezeagu LGA, Prof. Ahaneku and Prof. Ezeonu. I equally appreciate the contributions of Engr. Nkedilim Chigbata, Dr. E.C Okoli, Engr. Geoffery Okongwu, the Onowu of Akama-Oghe & his cabinet, Rev Fr. Jacob Ugwuoke, among numerous others", Prof. Udedi stated.

Highpoints of the occasion include conferment of Chieftaincy title of "Ife Mba 1" to the Vice-Chancellor as for his great contribution to the project, presentation of gift items by various community groups to the Prof. Udedi.

Recall that Nnamdi Azikiwe University is one of the nine (9) Federal universities selected for the hybrid solar installation which will create a sustainable, uninterrupted power supply for the University in the first phase of Rural Electrification Agency (REA) project.

Addressing the inductees, the Special Adviser to the Vice-Chancellor on Academic Matters, Prof. Charles Esimone, FAS represented by the Director of Information and Public

## **FACULTY OF AGRIC. HOLDS 2ND INSECT FARMING AND ERADICATION OF RURAL POVERTY SEMINAR**



The Faculty of Agriculture recently held their 2<sup>nd</sup> seminar on Insect Farming and Eradication of Rural Poverty at Ekwueme Centre for Multidisciplinary Research hall.

The seminar focused on insect nutrition & food security, not only for feed formulation for fish and livestock but also for human consumption.

Addressing the attendees, the resource person, Mr. Remi Lanitieri Jullien pinned his entomological discourse on cricket species especially the commonly-found house and tropical house crickets. Mr. Lanitieri described crickets as poor feed choice for farmers due to its high cost of raising but very good for human consumption. "Insects (another chief source of protein) can be useful in varieties of ways, and so is good waste management. Crickets especially pose badly for feed formulation because it is expensive to raise but are great multipliers, laying up to 500 to 2000 eggs per cycle and good as food for man," he said.

Responding to the talk, the anchor of the event and HOD, Animal Sciences, Dr. (Mrs.) C.I. Ebenebe, expressed her



gratitude for the event but raised concerns on the ecological factors to be considered before rearing insects. Another farm insect Dr. Ebenebe suggested to be looked into is the black soldier fly lava.

In attendance were the first Dean, Faculty of Agric., Prof. Peter Nwabude, the Head, Department of Agric Economics, Prof. Nkiru T. Meludu, among others.

## **STUDENT AFFAIRS UNIT HOLDS SEND-FORTH PARTY FOR RETIRED DEPUTY REGISTRAR, 8 OTHERS**
