3.3 DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY PROGRAMMES

Graduates from approved universities who hold Masters degree in the proposed field of study with minimum FCGPA of 3.50 on a 5 point scale or a minimum of 60% for universities that do not use the FCGPA

**INVITATION TO REGISTER/JOIN RESEARCH CLUSTERS**

The Vice Chancellor, Prof. Charles Okechukwu Esimone, FAS in his address to the University Community explained that research will form a major component of his tools for achieving project200. He laid emphasis on product/service oriented research (findings solve problems of society and hence, have potential for commercialization), and promised to provide support for researchers engaging in such types of research.

However, success in this type of research is easier when researchers work in **multidisciplinary groups**. Such groups also called Research clusters, have the privilege of a pool of experts from different disciplines leading to intellectual enrichment and a holistic view of the research project at hand. This promotes creativity, which results in high impact research that generates products/services used to solve problems of society. Furthermore, funding agencies including

Universities usually find it easier to deal with clusters than with individual or faculty-based groups.

In order to be able to participate in this upcoming research boom, Professors and Heads of departments of the University are invited to initiate the formation of clusters targeting any societal problems of their choice. The Directorate of Research, Innovation and University/Industry relations (DRIUIR) shall be willing to register these clusters and offer services/information at our disposal.

**COMMUNIQUE ARISING FROM THE 2019 FACULTY OF
MANAGEMENTSCIENCES INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE,
NNAMDI AZIKIWE UNIVERSITY, AWKA, ANAMBRA STATE, NIGERIA**

The Faculty of Management Sciences, Nnamdi Azikiwe University, Awka, held its 2019 International Conference with the theme “Managing Nigeria Economic Diversification: Lessons from Other Climes.” The Conference held between Thursday, 13th – Saturday, 15th June, 2019, was well attended by people from the academia, practitioners, policy-makers and business people/organized private sector. Deliberations centered on the need to diversify the economy away from oil to other sectors. At the end of the Conference, the participants noted the following:

- In line with recent report of the Nigerian economy, the components of the Nigeria's real GDP as follows: Agriculture, 25.1%; Oil industry, 8.7%; Non-oil industry, 13.6%; and services 52.7%. On this basis, one would be tempted to conclude that the economy is diversified, but this is just statistical appearance.
- This means non-oil sector account for 91.3%, but in terms of export it contributes only 20% and about 23% of public revenue.
- In terms of export, oil and gas accounts for over 80% leaving less than 20% for other items that make up the non-oil sector.
- The consequence of the low diversification of export earnings is the vulnerability of the country's foreign reserve and the exchange rate of the national currency to oil vitality.
- The diversification of the national economy is nominal and not effective diversification and that while diversification into non-oil activities could be a necessary condition for effective diversification; it is not a sufficient condition.
- That Nigeria operates Federal System politically; the economic system is essentially unitary. The unitary



arrangement in the concept and management of the Nigerian Economy, particularly the oil economy, is a major factor inhibiting Economic diversification.

- In addition to Dutch Disease and Resource Curse which are the recognized afflictions confronting resource-rich and particularly oil-rich, countries, Nigeria suffers from an additional ailment as a result of its amputated fiscal federalism: Nigerian Dominion Disease.
- There are four major types of diversification driven by different conditions, namely: natural-resource-based diversification, intensity-of-used-based diversification; knowledge-based diversification; and conservation-adaptation-based diversification.
- Economic diversification has been characterized by negative game-playing, tribalized management support, undue organizational politics and insufficient resource allocation to institutional activities.
- The Conference also note that the necessary canon for building and moving the Nigeria economic diversification ship depends on re-building and drawing up of Economic Diversification Policy.

RECOMMENDATION/RESOLUTION

The Conference recommends and resolves as follows:

1. The sufficient condition for economic diversification is that the services arising from non-oil diversification are sufficiently declined from the

oil sector and should have sufficient independent clients. This is because even as oil sector contributes only about 8% of GDP all other sectors: banking, agriculture, services, etc. are linked to the oil sector.

2. To achieve sustainable economic diversification the constituents' parts of the country should be made to have some level of independence. This implies that the Federal system must be re-visited so that it will be both political and economic. By so doing, the constituents' parts of the federation can take care of their resources, pursue policies and programs in line with the wishes and aspiration of its people, while contributing an agreed percentage to the centre.

3. The Conference recommends that the country should diversify from primary to secondary and not from primary to primary as this will help in creating employment and enhancing the value chain.

4. To achieve sustainable diversification, it was recommended that the quality of primary product should be enhanced to meet international standard for exportation and the agricultural sector should key into modern methods of farming and high yield produce..

5. Awareness of economic diversification policy should be in place thereby carrying all stakeholders and beneficiaries along.

6. Recommends that diversifying the economy horizontally and vertically, thereby developing each sector both up-stream and down-stream. Diversifying the non-oil sector and de-linking them from the oil sector so that the volatility and shocks from the oil sector will not impact adversely on the non-oil sector.
