3. REGISTRATION PROCEDURE:

- a. Registration starts on Monday, 5th and will end on Wednesday 14th August, 2019.
- b. Change of Course or Change of Institution into NAU (and its affiliate institutions) ends on Monday 29th July 2019. Any change after that day will not be valid.
- c. Visit **portal.unizik.edu.ng**
 - Click on 'Create Account'
 - Enter your UTME REG Number and a valid email address and click 'Send'. A verification code will be sent to your email instantly.
 - Copy the verification code and click on 'Continue'
 - On the form, enter your phone number, password, verification code (copied from email), select the access level and click on 'Submit'
 - Your login details will be sent to your email address instantly.
 - Continue with the application by logging in with the login credentials sent to your email
 - After successful login, click on 'Step One', click on 'Generate Application Form RRR'
 - Print the RRR (Remita) page, proceed to any bank of your choice nationwide to make a payment of N2,000 only
 - Login to the portal, click on 'Step Two', click

on 'Confirm payment', enter the RRR number and click on 'Verify payment'.

If payment already verified', then proceed to "Step Three".

- Click on 'Step Three', click on 'Fill Application Form', Fill out the application form. You can save each stage of the application and continue at a later time. Also, you can edit your information as often as possible within the registration period.
- Check the 'I Agree' box and click on "submit" button.
- Print out the Application Form and come along with it for your screening and POST UTME / DE examination.

Please note that candidates with WASCE and NABTEB should fill only their name, Exam No, Year and School/Centre where examination was taken. Candidates can always go back to update their O'Level result information for correctness.

4. TIME AND REQUIREMENTS FOR THE SCREENING EXERCISE

- a. Accreditation of candidates commences at 7.00am each day. Candidates should adhere strictly to the time scheduled for screening examination.
- b. Print out the Application Form from the University Portal and come along with it for your screening examination.
- c. The date and time for each candidate's examination will be shown on the POST UTME / DE PRINT-OUT

The minimum academic qualification is exactly the same as for those applying for admission through UTME, namely, five O' Level credits in the GCE, SSCE, TCII examinations or their equivalents. Faculty/Departmental requirements must also be fulfilled. Candidates with November/December GCE 2019 results are not eligible to apply. Candidates with additional qualification/s namely: UNIZIK Diploma, OND, HND, B.Sc or their equivalent should apply for Direct Entry.

METHOD OF APPLICATION

Candidates should

- Visit the CEP ICT Unit at the Utility Building
- Generate RRR pin for application form fee payment
- Take the RRR printout, to any Bank within the

Campus and make payment of N12,000 for application form. Then

- Go back to the CEP ICT Unit at the Utility Building for online Registration.

RETURN OF COMPLETED FORMS

Candidates should then

- Proceed to the CEP General Office to submit a photocopy of the online application form's printout with a photocopy of each of the claimed qualifications securely attached to the application form on or before Friday, October 25, 2019.

Note: Direct Entry candidates should also include a copy of their additional qualification/s to their submission and should endeavour to forward the academic transcript of their claimed additional qualification/s to the Director, CEP on or before Saturday December 7, 2019.

- There will be a Pre-Admission Computer-Based Test (CBT) on Saturday December 7, 2019.
- Candidates for Pre-Admission Computer-Based Test (CBT) must appear physically for Biometric Data Capturing at the CEP ICT Unit Registration Centre at the Utility Building from Friday October 25 to Friday November 8, 2019, at 8.00am daily.
- All screened and qualified candidates for the CBT should attend a compulsory crash (mock) Computer-Based Training on Saturday, November 23, 2019 at 8am at the University Digital Library for a fee of N1000 (one thousand naira) payable at the CEP ICT Centre at the Utility Building.
- Failure to appear for Biometric Capturing automatically disqualifies a candidate from participating in the Pre-Admission Computer-Based Test (CBT).

UNIVERSITY HOLDS LEADERSHIP TRAINING FOR TOP OFFICERS



As part of plans geared towards actualizing the #Vision200 of the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Charles Esimone, FAS, the University in collaboration with the Professional Leadership Practitioners Institute recently organized a 2-day workshop for top officers in the University.

The workshop which was facilitated by Professor Chinedu Nebo, Professor Ikenna Onyido, FAS and Dr. Vincent Anigbogu had its theme as "Moving towards a Top Ranked University: Education for Social Impact".

The Vice-Chancellor in his address stated that the workshop is vital in the administration's dream of ensuring that UNIZIK moves from its present position of 4029 in the world to 200 in ranking amongst top Universities in the globe.

He stated that the leadership training will help to focalize, redirect and change the notion and status quo regarding administration and management by officers of the ivory tower towards changing the face and re-inventing work ethic and service delivery.

Prof. Esimone explained that the workshop will look at the basic

ingredients that are needed to move from low level to a top ranking academic environment and move the University systematically in all its sphere of endeavour. He enjoined staff of the University to feast on this knowledge transfer with the aim of making them leaders that are credible, goal-oriented and society changers.

In his lecture, Prof. Nebo stated that to build a world class university is to grow top quality research institution where academic talent and sound governance are present noting that world class University ensures that teaching and learning are student centered.

He averred that an excellent administrative process will bring about a set of interrelated activities that will enable the University to achieve its goal.

Professor Onyido in his lecture stated that achieving a top ranked University status is a function of revamped administration, management and attitudinal change.

Speaking on National Development Models and The Role

of Education with emphasis on Nigerian Universities in time past and the present, Prof. Onyido asserted that for a University such as UNIZIK with the dream of becoming one of the Top 200 in the globe, all hands must be on deck in various sphere of administration and management vis-a-vis attitudinal change, curriculum dynamics, palatable atmosphere, equity and accountability from both genre of staff who are teaching and non-teaching in the community.

He highlighted some of the malaise troubling the Nigerian Public University system as time consciousness, shabby environment, petty trading in offices and hallways, high noise level in offices and hallways as well as craze for titles and fellowship. Prof. Onyido stated that academic culture and tradition is the DNA of the University system which makes it a model and solution provider to societal problems.

In his lecture, Dr. Anigbogu tasked the staff of the University on the need to adopt the farmers' mentality, via being goal-oriented, visionary and creative at all times. He expressed optimism that the workshop would turn around the attitude to work by staff of the University if fully embraced.

Highpoints of the workshop were the presentation of certificates to participants as well as the official unveiling of the ideals of Vision200 which borders on Research, Innovation, Academic Excellence, Administrative Reform and community service.
