UBS HOLDS 2ND INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE

The UNIZIK Business School has held her 2nd annual International Conference with focus on "Re-Engineering Africa's Economies

towards Sustainable Business Development".

Declaring the conference open, the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Charles Esimone, FAS stated that the theme is traceable to Africa's vulnerable dependence on the export of primary resources, whether of Agriculture or minerals, with a culpable neglect of value addition, compounded by the failure to use revenue earned from these exports particularly, during the boom periods of such resources to expand the productive base of the economy.

In his words, "The current economic plight of Nigeria is a case in point. It is a great irony of the economic theory of comparative advantage that a leading exporter of a primary resources for over sixty years now, in the instant case crude oil, has continued to import, to date, the finished products



derived from crude oil.”

Professor Esimone advised that attempt to re-engineer Africa's economies/business development should be anchored on exploiting the value chains of our primary resources, agricultural and minerals, expanding the portfolio investment and productive base of the economy, particularly with a view to exports.

Earlier in his remarks, the Director of UBS, Professor Au Nonyelu averred that this year's theme is apt and timely, given the state of the economy in post-colonial Africa. He stated that the situation in

Africa requires critical interrogation and if necessary, a complete abandonment of the old, now disused policies and strategies that have kept Africa down for too long.

Present at the conference include the keynote speaker and Dean Lagos Business School, Prof. EnaseOkonedo; former MD/CEO, May & Baker and Past DG, Standards Organization of Nigeria (SON), Dr. IkemOdumodu, High Chief Dr. Obiora Okonkwo, Dr. Clem Nwogbo, among others.
