

VC SPEAKS ON THE JOURNEY SO FAR



Prof. Charles Okechukwu Esimone, FAS recently spoke on the journey so far as the 6th substantive Vice-Chancellor of Nnamdi Azikiwe University. Prof. Esimone disclosed this in a heart-to-heart session with the crew of UNIZIK Comet Magazine led by the Head, Mass Communication Department, Dr. Uche Ebeze.

In his words, the Professor of Biopharmaceutics and

Pharmaceutical Microbiology said "My time in office has been smooth and turbulent so far but I'm not unfamiliar with the terrain because I had served as Deputy Vice-Chancellor before now."During the session, Prof. Esimone went on to outline two-pronged modalities to combat insecurity in the campus: first, external approach: the use and installation of CCTV cameras in sensitive areas, interface with State Security Service (SSS), Police, and the State government; and lastly the internal: Be your brother's keeper through the Students Union Government.

Upon the question of what went right this time in his emergence, the VC attributed the rancor-free nature of the composition of the 8th Governing Council whom he described as "impeccable people, they followed the right VCship template and did the right thing." The Chief Executive was not shy to admit that he was the right choice of God, too.

LOSS OF LANGUAGE EQUALS LOSS OF IDENTITY — PROF. NWOKOYE

professor of with the loss of the people's identity. Prof. bo Language Nwokoye stated this at the University Additorium while she delivered the University's 48th Inaugural Lecture, ia Nwokoye themed: Abu Ikpe: Ngwaoru na-agbazi argued that the Usoro Obibi Ndu.

In her lecture, Prof. Nwokoye on the subject

of Satirical Poem: A Tool for Character Reformation said witty poems are employed by writers to expose and criticize the ills, foolishness and corruption of an individual, society, leadership or government like tyranny, greed, pregnancy out of wedlock, hooliganism, prostitution, among other concerns. The Professor of Igbo Language went to say that every satirical piece has an intention, a motive behind the tranquil recollection. To Prof. Nwokoye, poetry is life, and life is embodied in poetry.

With the threat of foreign languages on Igbo language, the first Igbo inaugural lecturer went on to enunciate the

volatility of language where any loss, is tantamount to the loss of the speakers' identity.

Earlier in his remark, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Charles Esimone, FAS was full of praise for the inaugural lecturer, Prof. Nwokoye, for standing to defend the honour of Igbo Language hence a full life of education and rendition in Igbo. Prof. Esimone had expressed worry over Igbo Language which is fast dying and how Igbo parents let foreign languages erode their children's learning of the beautiful Igbo.

CENTRE FOR MIGRATION STUDIES HOLDS RETREAT FOR EFFECTIVE TEACHING AND LEARNING



he Centre for Migration Studies recently organized a week long retreat and workshop on Migration Modules development for selected lecturers.

The retreat which held in Enugu had its theme as Teaching Migration for Effective learning. Declaring the retreat open, the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Charles Esimone, FAS expressed satisfaction at the level of commitment and dedication to the project by those involved in it.

Professor Esimone pointed out that the establishment of the Centre is very instrumental to the overall mission and vision of the University system. He maintained that with the caliber of resource persons and lecturers involved, the centre is already geared towards the top. He thanked the partners, the International Organization for Migration and the Civil Society Organization Network on Migration and Development (CSOnetMADE) for identifying with the centre.

Earlier in his address, the Director of the Centre, Professor Ike Odimegwu stated that Migration is pivotal discourse and development issue in our world today. Professor Odimegwu noted that agencies, civil society organizations and international agencies and organizations have been active on the field of migration management and governance in Nigeria; but the academia has been significantly absent. He disclosed that CMS-NAU is the first Centre for Migration Studies in a Nigerian university and the second in West Africa.

The Director of the Centre explained that the Centre operates on the following philosophic foundations, "Fundamental rights of free movement and shelter founded on the absolute value of the human person; The rights of communities to protect their communal and cultural values; The duty of all to work for safe, orderly and regular migration".

He further asserted that the Centre aims at serving as a leading international Centre for the study of local and international migration dynamics with primary focus on Nigeria and Africa through a strategic, collaborative and integrated approach.

The resource persons at the retreat include Mr. Charles Nwanelo Anaelo, Migration Desk Officer, NCFRMI; Engr. Ekene Ezeasor, MICTU, UNIZIK; Rev. Fr. Dr. Emeka Xris Obiezu, National Coordinator, CSOnetMADE; Dr. Chinwe Anunobi, University Librarian, Federal University of Tech, Owerri; Mr. Henry Akwitti, National Program Officer, Data & Policy, IOM; Prof. Ngozi Agu, Department of Educational Foundations, UNIZIK; Prof. Lilian-Rita Akudolu, Department of Educational Foundations, UNIZIK and Prof. Tracy Utoh-Ezeajugh, Department of Theatre & Film Studies, UNIZIK.

Equally present at the workshop was the Chief of Mission, IOM, Mr Frantz Celestine who was represented by Mr. Henry Akwitti, National Program Officer, Data & Policy.
