MICROBES MUCH LIKE OIL DRILLING COMPANIES – PROFESSOR ESIMONE

The 49th inaugural lecturer and Vice-Chancellor, Nnamdi Azikiwe University, Prof. Charles Esimone, FAS recently has made a stunning comparison with the activities of microbes to that of oil drilling companies and the fiefdom of herdsmen. Prof. Esimone stated this at the University Auditorium while he delivered the University's 49th Inaugural lecture hinged on "Our Fight Against Unseen Enemies—The Microbes".

Prof. Esimone, a professor of Pharmaceutical Microbiology and Biopharmaceutics quickly declared that there is a Man-Microbe Conflict which has been continuous and ongoing with no winner at sight. "Microbes are minute forms of lives

exploitation of the ecosystem, microbes mind only themselves and see human's palms, rectum, colon, mouth, ears, class of people whether rich or poor as veritable host for conquest.

"Much akin to demons, microbes are not seen with the naked eyes but their actions are gravely felt. Microbes run the world, our lives too. As instrument of bio-terrorism in form of pestilence, they attempt to subdue man and sometimes, are tools by God to punish man for sin like HIV, Ebola, typhoid, pestilence, etc. Microbes have positive effects as they can help man achieve longevity and create riches for himself, like the microbial

that cannot be seen with a naked eye, one part per million," he said. Much like the oil drilling companies who are only interested in the economic

fermentation in beer, palm wine, among others."

Professor Esimone posited that microbes, the highest human killer beyond World Wars and famine are innocent with only interest in finding food and metabolic assistance from the host cell. The expert on viral vector assay proposed a few strategies to eliminate microbes totally: building robust impregnable immune system, possessing a better understanding of Man-Microbe differences, early diagnosis and diseases and improving of drug policy.

The lecture revealed that microbes have developed anti-microbial resistance hence certain pills are no longer effective. Prof. Esimone warned that certain herbal drugs carry a heavy anti-microbial resistance, hence raising the issue of safety and quality assurance. He further warned against the abuse of anti-biotics and ardent following of drug dosage.

The campaign which was tagged: "Arm Our Youths Health (ArOY) Campaign" was slated from 10th to 12th of September, 2019 and held in Nnamdi Azikiwe University, Awka.

Addressing participants, the founder, Dr. Ifediora explained that "ArOY campaign is the flagship health initiative of the OCI Foundation designed to be a wide-reaching, sustainable and cost-effective way of spreading anti-breast and anti-cervical cancer messages to millions of at-risk Nigerian women in a way that is timely, efficient and culturally-acceptable".

According to him, "the campaign targets students across all Senior Secondary Schools in Nigeria by introducing the relevant teachings into their regular academic curriculum, along with assessment/examination systems.

Through the CERVIBREAST mobile phone application currently on the Android's Google play

store, this campaign will potentially be within reach of every single Nigerian". Dr. Ifediora disclosed that the campaign has a formal endorsement from the prestigious Harvard Medical School, Boston, USA. On partnership with interested parties, the founder posited that the Foundation is willing to work with anyone, group, all interested government and non-governmental bodies to actualize a nationwide implementation of the project.

Flagging off the campaign, the Vice-Chancellor of Nnamdi Azikiwe University, Professor Charles Esimone, FAS described the initiative as laudable and worthy of support. Declaring the support and partnership of the University, Professor Esimone maintained the fight against cancer is a collective responsibility of everybody. In his words, "I am very pleased to have identified with OCI and I assure you that our commitment is complete and all encompassing. I am particularly excited on the sustainability measure of this campaign as it would go a long way in reducing mortality rate caused by breast and cervical cancer".

Highpoint of the flag-off ceremony include presentation of certificates to sponsors and ambassadors as well as unveiling Nnamdi Azikiwe University, Innoson Group, Anambra Broadcasting Service (ABS) as partners in progress.

UNIZIK BIDS FAREWELL TO 134 CHINA-BOUND SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS



The Director of Confucius Institute, Prof. Yu Zhangbao has called on students to remain focused in the business of Chinese language acquisition. Prof. Zhangbao made this call during the farewell event of the 134 China-bound scholarship recipients.

Prof Zhangbao, who appreciated the effort of the scholarship recipients for making UNIZIK CI 'the best CI in

all 164 countries,' asked for more hard work, saying it's a way to build a good reputation for the Institute.

During his remark, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Charles Esimone, FAS was full of happiness for the achievements of the students and the effort of their teachers in seeing that CI is moved to a greater height. The VC who was represented by the Deputy Director, Student Affairs, Dr. Emma Anakwuba encouraged the students to go extra mile to keep the doors of China open to more Nigerian students since the Institute has the potential to take students to China to study.

UNIZIK CI has crossed the threshold of getting 100 scholarships. Just recently, the 134 scholarship recipients include 38 in Masters' degree, 31 in Bachelors, 42 in One-year program and 23 in One-semester program. In all 528 CIs in 176 countries, only 35 students passed HSK level 6, 24 from UNIZIK CI. The 21 students that sat for the advanced HSKK in 2019 made 100% pass rate.
