The Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Administration), Prof. Carol Arinze-Umobi made this commendation on behalf of the Vice-Chancellor during a courtesy call by the wife of the governor.

Mrs. Obiano was in the University for the Fidelity Youth Entrepreneurship Academy/CAFE Skills Training Programme where over 200 undergraduate students benefitted.

In her remark, Mrs. Obiano commended the

University for their Entrepreneurship drive through the Chike Okoli Centre for Entrepreneurship Studies (COCES) which served as venue for the training exercise.

Addressing the students shortly after the call, the wife of the Governor urged them to maximize the opportunity to learn something new since the days of white collar job is virtually over. You can also offer useful services that can enable you make a profitable living after graduation.

Having seen you do practical work in class, I can attest to the transformational impact of what you are doing. As you go back to your respective schools,



you can start demonstrating what you have learnt here and you will surely see people who will patronize you. In fact, you can even assist your parents within a short time by paying your fees from the gains you make."

The Director of COCES, Prof Ngozi Anyikwa represented by the Deputy Director, Prof. Ngozi Ijomah thanked Mrs. Obiano for empowering the students, and prayed that God will reward her. She assured that the centre is well equipped

to handle training in various skills, stressing that the students have made tremendous progress in one week and will come back to specialize.

## **FACULTY OF ARTS MARKS 11TH ANNUAL INT'L CONFERENCE**

**T**he Faculty of Arts recently held its 11<sup>th</sup> Faculty's International Conference with a beam on Humanities and Leadership in Africa.

Declaring the conference open, the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Charles Esimone, FAS attributed the lamentable underdevelopment challenges of Africa to poor leadership which has led to abysmal human development indices.

Prof. Esimone stated that despite the fact that Nigeria is blessed with abundant human and material resources comparing Angola as the largest exporters of crude oil in Africa, the nation had a Human Development Index of 0.532 in 2017 as shown in the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) 2018 report, putting the country in the unenviable category of low development countries and ranking it as 157 of the 189 countries/territories surveyed.

He also stated that leadership can be viewed from two perspectives, as the activity of leading a group of persons or an organization to achievement of goals and also a process which articulate a clear vision, sharing the vision and providing the information, knowledge and methods needed to bring this vision to fruition.

Prof. Esimone maintained that the concept of humanities could be consciously utilized to breed a crop of leaders that are capable and willing to deploy the leadership-process for the common good and to conscientize the citizenry to hold the leadership accountable for their actions/inactions.

In his remark as Chairman on the occasion, the President and Group CEO Transnational Corporation of

Nigeria, Mr. Valentine Ozigbo posited that Nigeria is yet to get her leadership system right for shared economic development geared towards raising the status of the country on the global sphere.

Mr Ozigbo stated that leadership as a concept in Nigeria has failed and goes beyond Africa and the entire black race which raises the pertinent question "Is there something fundamentally wrong with the black man? The Chairman cited a case where in the early 70s, the nation rejected aids from Switzerland but some twenty years later have to rely on the aid from the western world in order to sustain governance.

He also stated that if Nigeria were to get their leadership question right, the country will be powerful and ascend from its present state as a third world country to a more comforting position.

He also opined that as leadership is being talked about it is paramount that fellowship is also talked about as it is a variable for transitional and dynamic leadership.

The Dean of the Faculty, Very Rev. Fr. Prof. Bonachristus Umeogu in his remarks averred that effective leadership and good followership are two critical viewpoints that is quintessential for cordial relationship between humans.

Prof. Umeogu stated that the major challenge of most African and black nations is leadership. The clergy stated that the time has come for Africans to look at leadership from the critical and speculative viewpoint of humanities. He opined that leadership entails management of human and material resources.

5. Adjustment and /or re-adjustment of spaces in the University in line with subsisting best practices
6. Removal of structures and/ or obstructions not in line with the NAU Master plan
7. Certification and re-certification of all spaces allocated in NAU
8. Numbering, Coding and Tagging of all spaces

9. Maintaining the University Master plan of all buildings in NAU
10. Digitization and simplification of the University space allocations
11. Sanitization and beautification of the University
12. Boosting the Internally Generated Revenue (IGR) of the University
13. Promptly and properly making recommendations to the Vice Chancellor on issues relating to design, construction, reconstruction, beautification and allocation of spaces in the University in line with the Master plan.

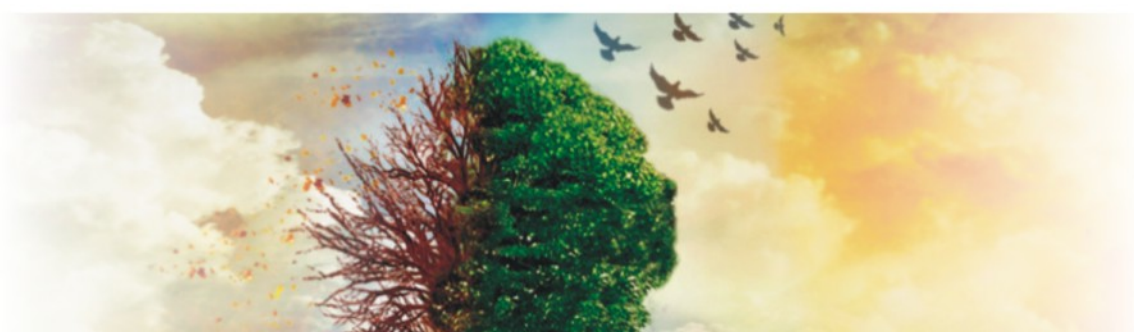
