## FACULTY BUILDING TO BE NAMED AFTER LATE PRO-CHANCELLOR

**T**he new Faculty building of the Faculty of Agriculture situated in Ifite-Ogwari is set to be named after the late Pro-Chancellor, Alhaji Azeez Oladotun Bello.

This was disclosed by a member of the University's Governing council and former Deputy Governor of Ekiti state, Surveyor Biodun Aluko who spoke on behalf of the Council delegation to the 40<sup>th</sup> Day Prayer of the late Pro-Chancellor.

Surv. Aluko while describing the late Pro-Chancellor as a man of integrity, honesty and an astute administrator, noted that the University council thought it noble to immortalize him by naming the Agric Faculty building after him. He explained that his leadership of the Council was very significant as three principal officers of the University were appointed – the Bursar, the Registrar and of recent, the Vice-Chancellor.

In a condolence message signed by Alhaji Isa Modibbo on behalf of the council, the late Pro-Chancellor having retired from Pfizer livestock PLC as Deputy Managing Director in 1989 and founded

his private business company, brought his boardroom experience in the private sector and other organizations to bear on the proceedings of council and its betterment. Alh. Modibbo noted that his calm but resolute disposition and administrative sagacity would be greatly missed in council.

On his part, the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Charles Esimone, FAS said that the University received sad news of the Pro-Chancellor's demise with immense shock. Prof. Esimone asserted that the sterling organizational skills and administrative competence, impacted positively in the conduct of the affairs of council. He maintained that among his many achievements as Chairman of council, most noteworthy is his presiding over the smoothest and most rancor-free selection process in the history of the University for the appointment of a Vice-Chancellor, leading to the appointment of the 6<sup>th</sup> substantive Vice-Chancellor of the University in May, 2019.

High point of the event was the 40<sup>th</sup> day Fidu prayer and overwhelming outpour of tributes by friends, family, well-wishers, business associates, among others.

## DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURAL ECONOMICS EMBARKS ON COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT OUTREACH

The Department of Agricultural Economics and Extension recently embarked on their community development program tagged: "Dangers of Storage and Processing of Food with Chemicals".

The outreach, which started with a procession from the Faculty of Agriculture arena, saw students of the department trooping out in mass to sensitize the University community on the dangers associated with processing and storing food with chemicals.

The convener of the outreach, Prof Nkechi Meludu, was visibly present on ground with a handful of other lecturers to help organize and kick start the outreach.

Speaking to newsmen, Prof. Meludu explained that the major motive behind the outreach is to inform the public on the dangers of Aflatoxin, which is a toxic substance that appear mostly in crops like groundnuts and corn.

According to her, "Groundnuts and other nuts need to be properly checked before being eaten, to ensure there are no green mass or mold on them. This green part are the Aflatoxin and people need to know about it, as it is very dangerous to our well-being.

"Also, people should avoid using chemicals to store their food, especially the chemical known as sniper. They should rather use hot pepper and other organic processes to preserve their food."

Also speaking on the rampant use of cellophane in cooking, the Professor, who also doubles as the Head of the Department went on to plead that "people shouldn't cook with or eat anything

cooked with nylon bags as they emit chemicals into the food during the cooking period which can lead to cancer.

"This outreach is focused also on storage. There are particular types of plastics that absorb oil from food stored in them and changes colour easily. These type of plastic containers must have also emitted chemicals into the food as well."

She emphasized that community development programs are made to close the gap between the gown and the town.

Also speaking to UNIZIK Press, the course representative of the students, Mr Chigozie Fortune Anaboh, revealed that the outreach is a societal awareness dwelling on 3 major themes. "We are sensitizing the public on the effects of what we call Aflatoxin in maize and groundnuts.

Also, the effect of cooking with nylon materials, as many people cook some their food with foils or nylon bags. These food are good for our health but the method of preparing them are unhygienic and unhealthy, as they contain some substances that are emitted into the food", he said.

The outreach saw the students carrying banners and placards which read "Problems Associated with Aflatoxin", "Food cooked with Nylon bag is Poisonous", among others.

The students made brief stops at strategic locations to sensitize and enlighten staff and students.
