LASSA FEVER: DIRECTOR, MEDICAL CENTRE CALLS FOR RENEWED PRECAUTIONARY MEASURES OF HYGIENE

Following the recent Lassa fever case in the University, the new Director, University Medical Centre, Prof. Lasbery Asomugha has called on the University community to embrace precautionary measures of hygiene to minimize contact and spread.

Prof. Asomugha gave this advice in a press statement recently following an index case of Lassa fever in the state.

The statement reads:

"We wish to inform the university community that a 200L Education student who was admitted into the Medical Center and later discharged herself against medical advice was later diagnosed to be a case of Lassa fever at the Chukwuemeka Odumegwu Ojukwu University Teaching Hospital Amaku.

"Once the diagnosis was made, the Public Health Department of the Anambra State Ministry of Health got in touch with our medical center. Prior to this, once the patient was discharged against medical advice, going by standard discharge protocol, the ward and the conveniences were adequately decontaminated and the environment made safe for both patients and members of the medical staff.

"Contact tracing has been done for both medical personnel and students who had primary contact with the index case and they are being followed up to monitor for secondary transmission.

"The Medical center in collaboration with the public Health Department of the Ministry of Health has been organizing sensitization and awareness campaigns for the staff of the Medical Center to enable the center cope better.

"We want to use the medium to state that the medical center is safe to offer services to the members of the public as the facility has been adequately decontaminated. Members of the University community should ignore any negative social media publicity as the university is up and doing as regards the upsurge of cases of Lassa fever throughout the country. It will be necessary to note that Lassa fever is endemic in Nigeria and the natural history is that there is usually an upsurge in case presentation between the months of November and May. We therefore enjoin every individual to undertake the basic precautionary measures of hygiene to minimize contact and spread.

"Importantly, our telephone correspondence with the index case this afternoon on 31/01/2020 revealed she was recuperating well. We want to express our gratitude to the public health department of the Anambra State Ministry of Health for the cooperation so far".

2019/2020 MATRICULATION: VC TASKS STUDENTS ON DILIGENCE IN THEIR STUDIES



Students of Nnamdi Azikiwe University, Awka have been asked to be diligent in their studies. The Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Charles O. Esimone, FAS gave the advice during the Matriculation ceremony for fresh students held on Friday, 31st January, 2020.

In his address, which was delivered simultaneously at the fourteen (14) faculties in the University, the Vice-Chancellor noted that the ceremony was preceded by orientation programme which ended on Wednesday, 29th January, 2020. Prof. Esimone further reiterated his determination to catapult the University in the rank of two hundred (200) Universities in the world before the end of

his five-year tenure.

The Vice-chancellor reminded the students of their obligation in the University, their parents and themselves. These include, among other things, payment of their school fees on time, prompt attendance to lectures (75% attendance), avoidance of examination misconduct, shunning of certificate forgery and cultism, etc.

Concluding his speech however, the Vice-Chancellor enjoined the students to remember why they are in the University; believing that their stay in the University would end in their being found worthy in Character and Learning, leading to the conferment of the degree of the University.

Meanwhile, the fresh undergraduate students took the oath of loyalty administered by the Deans thus signaling their formal admittance into the University.

A cross section of the people interviewed applauded the Management for the decentralization of the Matriculation exercise, noting that it conferred on the faculties an element of independence in governance as well as witting down the chaotic trend in centralizing the event in the past.

UNIZIK DIRECTORATE OF INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATION AND LINKAGES SOLICITS FOR INTEGRATION OF LINKAGES

The Directorate of International Collaboration and Linkages, has called for an Integration of all External and Internal collaboration and linkages in the University to be domiciled with the Directorate.

In a memo from the Director, Prof. Ifeoma Enweani which was approved by the Vice-Chancellor, Deans of Faculties, Directors of Directorates, Heads of Departments, and Coordinators of Units were charged to make available of all pieces of Information concerning collaboration and linkage to the Directorate of International Collaboration and Linkage for effective monitoring and updates.

According to the Director, "It is observed that there is a lacuna between the Directorates and different units of the University which militates against the smooth progress of the Directorate in achieving her mandate". More so, the Director stated that the Directorate's staff members shall pay visits to various Faculties and Directorates for sensitization in order to achieve success.

The Director ended by stating the urgency for a database of all activities involving internal and external collaboration and linkage conference, academic units, exchange programmes, post-doctoral fellowships among others.

VC GIVES KUDOS TO AGRIC FACULTY ON LECTURE SERIES

The Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Charles Esimone, FAS has commended the Faculty of Agriculture for advancing #Project200 drive of his administration through lecture series in the Faculty.

The Vice-Chancellor represented by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor Academic, Prof. F.J.C. Odibo, made the commendation during the 3rd Faculty lecture which held at the faculty's lecture hall.

In his remark, the VC commended the Dean of the faculty, Prof. Ernest Igwe for his effort in making the vision of moving the Faculty to Ifite-Ogwari a success. He also applauded the Dean for initiating such a programme within the Faculty as it will encourage more research, urging them to maintain the tempo.

UNIZIK DIRECTORATE OF QUALITY ASSURANCE COMMENCES CERTIFICATION OF ARTICLES FOR GRADUATE STUDENTS

In furtherance of the actualization of #project 200 by the University's present administration, the Directorate of Quality Assurance has commenced the certification of articles for its graduate students with effect from October 2, 2019.

According to the Director of Quality Assurance, Prof Eric Ofoedu, Chapter 4 of General Regulation for Postgraduate programme, section 4.7.3d outlined the criteria for the Award of the Degree of Doctorate of Philosophy. He further said that cap xiii of the regulation states as follows: Before the award of PHD, the doctorate candidate must have published at least two articles from the dissertation or seminars in recognized academic journals indexed and with online presence.

On the roadmap for the certification exercise, professor Ofoedu stated that henceforth

- i. All candidates for the Master's degree shall obtain Certification of Quality of at least one article published in ISI web of science indexed journal, such as Thompson Reuters, scopus, ECIMAGO, SNIP. From the Directorate of Quality Assurance before final defense.
- ii. All candidate for the Doctor of Philosophy degree shall obtain Certification of Quality at least two articles from the PHD dissertation published in recognized ISI web of science indexed journal, such as Thompson Reuter, scopus, SCIMAGO, SNIP, from the Directorate of Quality Assurance before defense.
