IMPORTANT UPDATES ON THE TETFUND SCHOLARSHIP INTERVENTION FOR ACADEMIC STAFF GUIDELINES.

An update on the guideline for TETFUND scholarship intervention for Academic staff has been released. According to the Executive Secretary of TETFUND in a memo signed by the Acting Director, Academic Staff Training and Development, Arc. Babatunde Olajide to the Vice-Chancellor, Nnamdi Azikiwe University, Awka dated 5th December, 2019, the following guidelines are henceforth to be followed:

1. All prospective scholars who wish to be sponsored by the Fund and who would be commencing their study programs by September 2020 are mandatorily required to submit their applications for sponsorship to the Fund not later than 31st May, 2020. Any application that is received after this date will only be considered against the next due date of commencement of studies which is January of the following year.
2. Application for scholarship will now be processed for payment en-bloc by the Fund at two

(2) different times of the year, i.e May for those commencing their study program in January, 2021.

3. Prospective Scholars are specifically required to obtain a tuition fee invoice from their intended training institution that would state the total amount payable as tuition for the entire duration of their study program and forward same to TETFUND with their admission letters. The invoice should contain the total fee payable for the entire duration of study and NOT for one (1) year only as has been the practice all along. The same invoice should bear the full name of the prospective scholar, and the bank account details of the institution, where the tuition will be paid. For the avoidance of doubt, the details should include: Total amount payable for the course duration, which must be shown on the invoice,

Bank Name, Bank Address, Account Number, Sort Code, ABA routing No (for USA Institutions) SWIFTBLC code, IBAN NO for Europe and UK institutions, Transit Code (for Canadian institutions), and IFSC number for Indian institution and other such parameters that will easily enhance payment of the applicable fees. Any application for scholarship that does not meet this mandatory requirement will not be considered for sponsorship by the Fund.

4. Conveyance of approval will only be given as a notification, but the release of the funds will be put on hold until after the end of the period for submission that is, MAY and OCTOBER. Tuition, however will be paid directly to the training institution, while the upkeep and other related allowances will be credited to the home institution's TETFUND dedicated account for the scholar.


Meanwhile, the Executive Secretary wishes to convey the Board's approval to the effect that unconfirmed academic staff of the institution would now be beneficiaries of the TETFUND scholarship as against the practice before. Again, beneficiary institutions are free to present for sponsorship, PhD scholars desirous of sponsorship for Bench work abroad, notwithstanding whether they are being sponsored by TETFUND locally, or not. Moreso, beneficiaries of this are restricted only to those doing their PhD program in Nigeria.

Meanwhile, the refined operational processes for scholarship applications will take effect from January 1, 2020 for study program commencing in September, 2020.

A total of #7,470,368.00(seven million, four hundred and seventy thousand, three hundred and sixty-eight naira) has been approved by the board of trustees of TETFUND as the final tranche for the completion of research projects earlier submitted and approved for Nnamdi Azikiwe University, Awka under year 2016-2017(merged) TETFUND intervention in research project.

In a release by the Ag. Director, Education Support Service TETFUND office Abuja, Dr Salihu Girei Bakari in which he conveyed the approval of the board of trustee of TETFUND to the Vice-Chancellor, he affirmed that approval is for the finalization of the under listed projects as detailed in the institution's earlier submission. Meanwhile, Dr Bakari stated the conditions for the release of the allocation as follows:

- That the sum of #7,470,368.00 representing 40% (2nd tranche) of the approved amount of #18,675,920.00 for 12 Nos IBR project(s) is being credited directly into the University's designated bank account through electronic funds transfer. The director of finance and investment of the fund will confirm when the transfer is effected.
- That payment is being made for the completion of 12 numbers approved research projects as submitted.
- That the payment into the dedicated TETFUND bank account of the approved lead Researcher of the institution (submitted to the fund) must be made immediately and evidence of same forwarded to the fund within 2 weeks of release of funds.

- In view of the successful completion of the 12 Nos IBR projects, the university is expected to submit three (3) bounded copies of a close-out report on the intervention to TETFUND within three (3) months of completion of the project.
- The university is to always quote the project No. TETFUND/DESS/UNIV/AWK/RG VOL 1, on all correspondence on the projects and its product(s) when completed in line with the memo on the inscription earlier sent to it.

The Ag. Director finally reminded the university of the summary of transactions in respect of its research project intervention programme for 2016-2017 (merged) which stands as balance for 2nd/final tranche.
