#### 01 THE OPENING

I am glad to welcome senate to its 218th meeting, after the break occasioned by the general elections.

### 02 ACADEMIC MATTERS

## 2.1 Closure of Universities and Inter-University Centres for the 2023 General Elections.

In compliance with the instruction of the National Universities Commission, arising from the directive of the Hon. Minister of Education, the University shut down from Wednesday 22nd February, 2023 for the Presidential/National Assembly elections and the Gubernatorial/State Houses of Assembly elections. The university resumed on 20th March, 2023, after the conduct of the re-scheduled Gubernatorial and House of Assembly Elections. A revised academic calendar for the 2021/2022 academic year has consequently been published. Second semester examinations are scheduled from Tuesday 11th April to Thursday 21st April, 2023. Vacation is from Monday, 24th April to Friday, 12th May, 2023. The 2022/2023 academic year commences on Monday, 15th May, 2023.

2.2 A Special Request for Academic Curriculum on Substance and Addiction Studies from the Cameroonian Ministry of External Relations.

The Cameroonian High Commission in Nigeria through its letter, Ref. No: 1206/L/HCCN/CS/22 dated 26th October, 2022, has requested for the University's Curriculum on substance and addictive studies for onward transmission to the Cameroonian Ministries of Higher Education and Secondary Education.
